



#### **IUU FISHING – MAY 2025 SUMMARY**

#### **Statistics:**

- A total of 31 incidents were reported in comparison to May 2024, reflecting a decrease of 22.

- No incidents were reported for violation of certification conditions, marking a decrease of 2.
  Harvesting of prohibited species accounted for 2 incidents, a reduction of 9.
  The use of illegal nets saw a notable increase, with 25 incidents reported—17 more than in May 2024.
  Only 1 incident involving illegal methods was recorded, indicating a sharp decrease of 27.
- Meanwhile, 3 incidents of explosive fishing were reported, showing a decrease of 1 compared to May 2024.

- Compared to May 2024, the use of illegal nets has increased, while incidents involving illegal methods and the
- harvesting of prohibited species have decreased.

   Notably, No incidents of violation of certificate conditions was reported in may 2025. Whereas such cases were reported in may 2024. Harvesting Prohibited Species




#### Statistics:

No incidents were reported in the Gulf of Mannar, Eastern Coast, Palk Bay, and other areas, same as May 2024.





#### **MARITIME INCIDENTS – MAY 2025 SUMMARY**

#### Statistics:

- A total of 19 maritime incidents were reported in May 2025, reflecting a decrease of 24 compared to May 2024.
- Among these, six incidents involved patients onboard, marking an increase of three, while no deaths were reported—a
- decrease of one from the previous year.
   The reported incidents also included five EPIRB activations and one case categorized under fire onboard, man overboard, or no communication.
- No incidents were reported under arrival overdue, grounding, capsizing, or collision.

• The total number of incidents has slightly decreased compared to last year, with a noticeable rise in patient onboard cases. It is reassuring to note that no serious incide




#### DRUG SMUGGLING INCIDENTS - MAY 2025 SUMMARY


#### CONTRABAND SMUGGLING INCIDENTS - MAY 2025 SUMMARY

#### Statistics:

- Nine incidents of contraband smuggling were reported in May 2025, marking an increase of seven compared to May
- Among these, one incident involved cardamom, while seven incidents were related to kenda leaves.
- No incidents were reported involving glyphosate, gold, or turmeric.

- The focus of smuggling appears to have shifted toward agricultural products, with cardamom and kendu leaves being the most frequently smuggled items, indicating a rising trend.
  This aligns with the seasonal pattern, as kendu leaf smuggling typically peaks around this time each year.



#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY – MAY 2025**

#### Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) Fishing:

Compared to May 2024, the use of illegal nets has increased, while incidents involving illegal methods and the harvesting of prohibited species have decreased. Notably, no incidents of explosive fishing or violation of certification conditions were reported in May 2025, whereas such cases were recorded in May 2024.

<u>Poaching</u>: A total of 2 incidents were reported in the Palk Strait, reflecting an increase of 1 incident compared to May 2024.

<u>Maritime Incidents</u>: The total number of incidents has slightly decreased compared to last year, with a noticeable rise in patient onboard cases. It is reassuring to note that no serious incidents, such as deaths, capsizing, or collisions, were reported.

<u>Drug Smuggling</u>: Four incidents of drug smuggling were reported in May 2025, marking an increase of four compared to May 2024. These incidents involved local cannabis, ICE, and heroin, indicating a broader range of narcotics compared to the previous year.

<u>Contraband Smuggling</u>: The focus of smuggling appears to have shifted toward agricultural products, with cardamom and kendu leaves being the most frequently smuggled items, indicating a rising trend. This aligns with the seasonal pattern, as kendu leaf smuggling typically peaks around this time each year.

**Human Smuggling**: No incidents of human smuggling were reported in May 2025, maintaining stability in this category.

<u>Explosive and Firearms Smuggling</u>: No incidents of explosive and firearms smuggling were reported in May 2025, maintaining stability in this category.

Overall Analysis: In May 2025, maritime security trends revealed a mixed picture across various categories. While the overall number of incidents slightly declined compared to May 2024, certain areas saw notable increases. Illegal, Unreported, and Unregulated (IUU) fishing remains a concern, particularly with a rise in the use of illegal nets. However, positive signs emerged with a decrease in incidents related to illegal methods, harvesting of prohibited species, and the absence of explosive fishing or certification violations. Similarly, maritime safety showed improvement, with no reports of deaths, capsizing, or collisions, despite a slight rise in patient onboard cases. Poaching activity in the Palk Strait rose modestly, with two incidents reported—one more than the previous year.

Smuggling activities reflected shifting patterns, especially toward agricultural contraband. Nine contraband smuggling cases were reported, primarily involving kendu leaves and cardamom, which aligns with seasonal trends. Drug smuggling incidents increased to four, involving local cannabis, ICE, and heroin, indicating a broader narcotics footprint compared to 2024. Encouragingly, no incidents of human smuggling or
